



Aspire Academy Pupil Premium Spend Report 2019-20

The Government introduced the Pupil Premium in April 2011, as a means of addressing underlying inequalities between children from low income families who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers, by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The following are categories of pupils that are eligible:

- Children who are either currently eligible for FSM or have been eligible for FSM in the past six years;
- Children who have been looked after by a local authority (in care) continuously for more than six months;
- Children who have been adopted from care

Strategy/Intervention	Predicted Cost	Objective
FOCUS Counselling	£1000	Improving the ability to express feelings and needs appropriately.
Breakfast and cooking lessons	£6000	Ensure students are nourished before lessons start; enable all students to access Food lessons
Enhanced Speech and Language provision	£10 000	To enhance the EHCP statutory provision through 1:1 sessions and group work to improve social use of language
TA support	£20 000	An extra TA to support across the two centres; support 1:1 interventions.
Wansdyke Play Association	£1000	To improve access to learning & improve the ability to manage behaviour and feelings. Avoid exclusions.
1:1 Tutor	£360	Maths tutor for Year 11 student to enhance provision and ensure target is met.
