



Aspire Academy Year 7 Catch-Up Premium Report 2018-19

The DfE has made additional funds available for improving the attainment of our disadvantaged pupils. This grant is known the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium. The funds are primarily aimed at improving maths and English levels at key stage 2 (KS2). An allocation is made for every pupil who has not achieved the 'expected standard' in reading or maths at KS2 as per the October school census.

This short report summarises how the previous year's funding was spent and how we intend to spend this year's funding. Most importantly, it provides information on the outcomes of the spending and the improvements made amongst our pupils.

Spending of the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium 2018-19
Objectives:
To support the attainment of these pupils and aid their progression into the secondary curriculum.
Summary of spending:
£1307.95 – Crick software + 20 computer licences £599.66 – Clicker + Clicker books + 20 licences
Unspent monies from last year were used to balance the account.

Interventions:

- 1 : 1 support instigated on a regular basis for 1 student in a separate work room to help with concentration skills and avoid distractions
- Specific guidelines and layout frames provided for organisation of work for 1 student
- 1: 1 confidence boosting support to increase work speed/output for 1 student
- Dyslexia diagnosis for 1 student
- Doodlemaths purchased
- 3D visual aids purchased
- Training for literacy co-ordinator in phonics and intervention strategies
- Unit of Sound upgraded – more appropriate for secondary students

All 3 have made good progress and we continue to implement strategies and interventions throughout their time at Aspire to accelerate their progress and get them to the required standard.

Currently, one of the pupils is almost working at the expected standard. All will continue to access the interventions listed above. Added to this, one of the pupils will access an online Comprehension Booster and all pupils will have an individualised spelling catch up folder to assist with progress in this area.
